Last newsletter we told you that in the Diocese of Zambezia, Mozambique, they have been given two gifts recently, many thanks to you, the donors. The first, is the gift of clean fresh drinking water from 4 new wells. The second, is the everlasting gift of the Living water. Bishop Vicente has told us that these two gifts have had an immediate impact, in at least two ways.

1 The fresh drinking water:

The four communities (2 each in the districts of Molumbo and Milange) each have a borehole (well with a pump). They were identified as having a severe shortage of clean safe drinking water, and had a sustainable supply available. It was determined that as well as fresh clean drinking water, there was a need for good hygiene and sanitation not only in these villages, but also in surrounding villages. When the discussion centred on good hygiene, it was determined that there was a need for low-cost latrines. These would need to be built using local materials, and available for each village. (A total of 85 latrines have been built by the communities in the last three-month period).

As has been previously mentioned (in earlier newsletters), there is a small fee charged to each family, to be set aside for ongoing maintenance for the wells.

2 Eternal Living Water:

During this last three-month period, the teaching of hygiene and Christian Values (a programme nicknamed WASH) was run. These teaching programmes increased trust among the villagers and the Faith Leaders, and allowed for the sharing of the Word to all the families in these villages (~1900 families currently). As a result, 30 churches have now been planted, meeting in the shade of trees.

Bishop Vicente tells us that the villages have begun to build and stockpile bricks, to prepare for church buildings. ARDF Australia (ARDF A), has already agreed to support this church planting with agreement to pay for 15 church roofs (corrugated steel), to be placed on the brick walls, when brick building and funding is complete!





WASH committees established in the communities of Messiasse and Nanssato

A story from the field:



Maria Joao attends school in the community of Messiasse. To get safe drinking water, Maria walks about 5km daily. At times she is not able to attend classes, which affects her grades. She has often had stomach problems because her family would sometimes drink water from a nearby river. She tells us: "My mother was very always getting sick so she depends on me for house chores. I want to help her as much as I could, but in the past, it was difficult for me the work was a burden having to walk and see safe drinking water", this prior to the new well. After the new borehole and well, Maria is happy to say that, "these days my school performance has improved, even my teachers are surprised with my grades. This is because that I no longer have to walk long distances and my mother is getting better! I believe that is due to the fact that we are now drinking safe water."
